Dr. Mark Thompson is in his 27th year at Stanislaus State and is a Professor of Rhetoric who specializes in rhetorical theory—that is, in a broad sense, how people argue and persuade, create meaning and create truth. His doctorate was interdisciplinary, combining rhetorical theory, cognitive psychology, statistics, and research design. His teaching and research interests are rhetoric, critical thinking, academic technology, gamification, information literacy, and teaching teachers. 

Twelve faculty members attended the workshop.

Qualtrics is an online survey tool at Stanislaus State and is available to support research, teaching, and administration. The Office of Academic Technology (OAT) is promoting a new Digital Transformation Initiative (DTI). DTI is an intentional and coordinated series of seminars, workshops, and events to integrate the systemic use of technology for teaching, learning, and research.

These past six-months have been a busy one for OAT! We launched our first official Office of Academic Technology logo under the Office of the Provost, and we are now promoting the Digital Transformation Initiative (DTI): where being digitally literate and fluent isn't just about getting to the destination, it's about the process and the journey of arriving at the destination. As a part of the DTI, we are offering a series of workshops designed to shape teaching, learning, and technology with intentions. Last fall, we offered a series of workshops in partnership with vendors from Canvas and Blackboard as we begin our LMS evaluations along with Zoom Webinar with our sister campuses, Cal State East Bay and San Jose State University on their respective transitions from Blackboard Learn to Ultra and Desire2Learn to Canvas.
